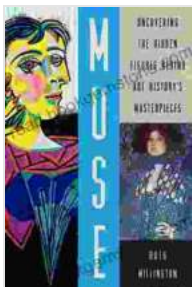

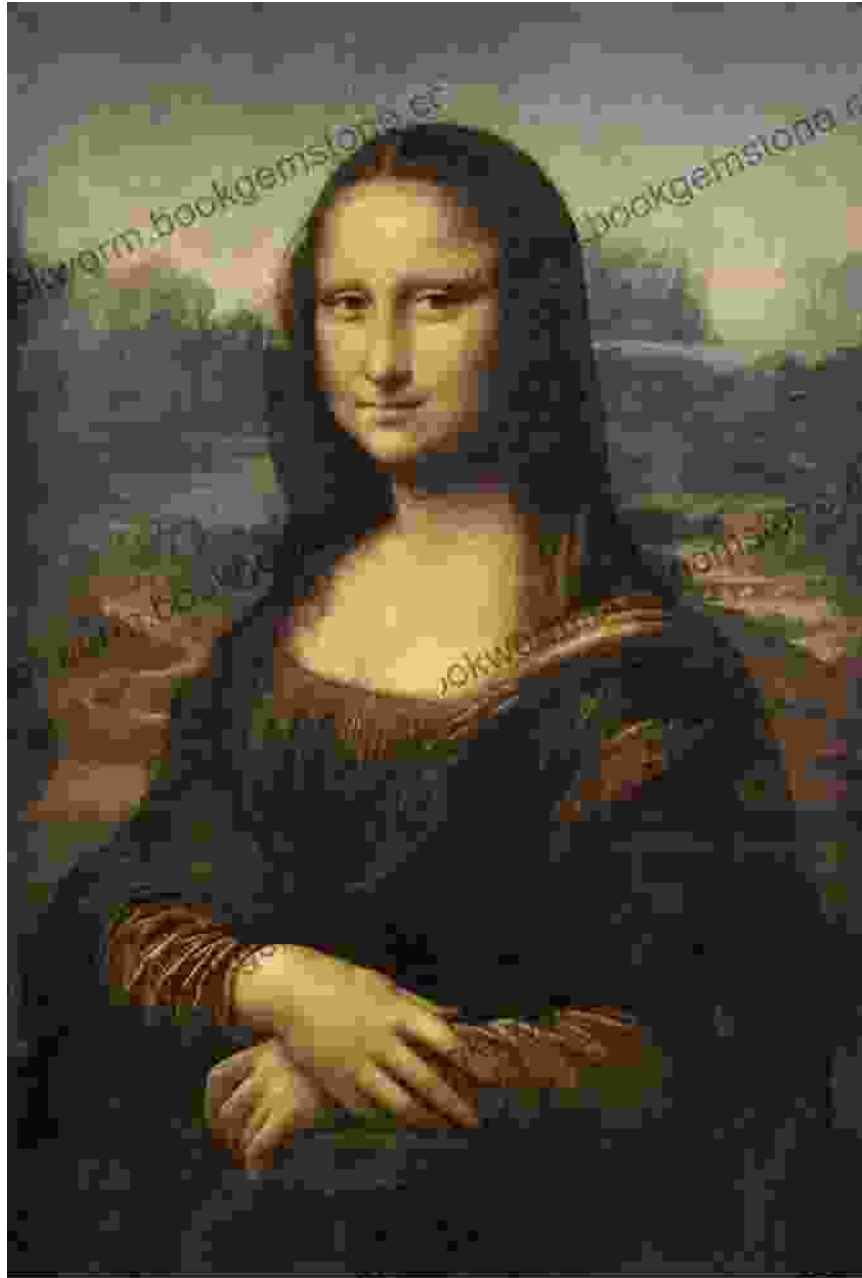


Judith Beheading Holofernes by Artemisia Gentileschi, c. 1614-1620. (Uffizi Gallery)

assistants, Jacopo Torni, played a particularly significant role in the creation of the ceiling's iconic frescoes.

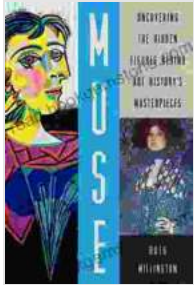


The Sistine Chapel ceiling by Michelangelo and Jacopo Torni, c. 1508-1512. (Vatican Museums)

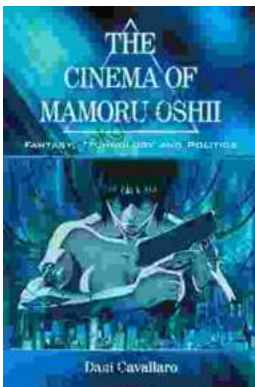
One such figure is the muse of the French artist Jean-Auguste-Dominique Ingres. Ingres' muse, Pauline

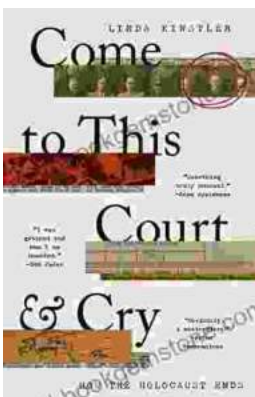
